This form of silent, imageless prayer using a mantra or prayer word is rooted in the Gospel, the letters of St Paul and originated with the early Desert Fathers of the 4th century. A Benedictine monk, Father John Main OSB (1926-1982) has rediscovered this ancient prayer tradition for contemporary men and women. There is now a World Community for Christian Meditation (www.wccm.org) which supports over 800 Christian Meditation groups across the globe.
